ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Karnataka Samskrit University (KSU) has consistently upheld its vision of achieving excellence in Higher Education and enjoys the status of being amongst the best Sanskrit Universities in India. The University was established in 2010 in Bengaluru, Karnataka, India. Karnataka Samskrit University has gained approvals from University Grants Commission (UGC with 2(f) status and 12(B) status. Recognised as a State Sanskrit University, it has 31 Sanskrit institutes all over Karnataka. This University consists of three constituent Sanskrit colleges, 14 aided colleges and 15 UG centres. Karnataka Samskrit University comprises main four wings that are inclusive of Coaching, Analysis, Advertisement and Departmental. These wings work together and focus on teaching and research in Sanskrit language, Literature, Vedic Studies, along with several Shastras. It provides courses at UG, PG, doctoral, post-doctoral, diploma and certificate level, including BA, MA, PhD, MPhil programmes, among others.

LOCATION:

The University is based in one of the progressive cities of India, Bengaluru which is popularly known as the Silicon Valley of India. The University is situated at Chamarajpet, near the Kannada Sahitya Parishad and the Makkalakoota. It is at a distance of 4k.m. from the Bengaluru city Railway Station and Kempegowda (Majestic) Bus stand.

MOTTO:

Motto for the university has been chosen from Srimanmahabharata of Vedavyasa. The motto has been represented in Devanagari script in the logo. 'prajvālito jñānamayaḥ pradīpaḥ' indicates the supremacy of knowledge. This motto represents the objective of the university to unite ancient and modern knowledge systems. The lamp of knowledge should light up this world, going beyond place and time – this is the objective. This lamp will never be extinguished. It is not fueled by oil, but by knowledge itself, and will continue to burn forever. The logo and motto of the university represent this dream, with which the university has been set up. The vast expanse of knowledge which will be nurtured by the university is

symbolically represented by the peacock in the logo. It emphasizes the vision that human life should be entwined inseparably with knowledge.

VISION:

The University promotes the traditional system of education, and focuses on the development of Sanskrit language through its four wings which are administrative, research, publication, and teaching. KSU facilitates advance study and research in the fields such as Geeta-based Management Science, Yoga-based Human Psychology, Archaeology, Ancient Science, Ayurvedic Science, Humanities, Social Science, Performing Arts, Fine Arts and Communication, etc. regions. University is currently working of the Choice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS) as per new National Education Polity approved in 2021 by Govt. of Karnataka.

 modern scientific and technological studies.

- To translate/publish all the Vedas, Shastrik works and related texts, Bhashyas and Commentaries in Kannada and other languages.
- To build-up audio, audio-visual records of Vedic Chanting and related traditional practices.
- To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional, research and extension facilities to the promotion of Sanskrit Language and such other branches of learning as it may deem fit.
- To make special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences and science in its educational programmes.
- To educate and train manpower for the overall development, promotion, preservation and research in the field of Sanskrit and Sanskrit traditional subjects.
- To take appropriate measures for promoting inter-disciplinary studies and research in the university and such other related activities congenial at University level.
- To collect, preserve, critically edit and publish rare manuscripts and ancient works by establishing an Oriental Research Institute in Samskrit.

- To computerize and digitize the entire corpus of manuscripts and Samskrit texts.
- To bring out Research journals of high standard through the University/Departments.
- To organise seminars, conferences, workshops, Vidvath Goshties with a view to promoting awareness about the messages contained in ancient knowledge systems.
- To admit educational institutions not maintained by the university to the privileges of the University as affiliated colleges/mahapathashalas/pathashalas in Karnataka.
- To provide through its professors, teachers and the Department; a special research institutes such teaching and guidance as the affiliated colleges/mahapathashalas/pathashalas may require.

VIDYAVARIDHI (Doctor of Philosophy)

VIDYAVARIDHI (Doctor of Philosophy) is offered in the following Subjects / Areas.–Nyaya &Vaisheshika, Vyakarana, AdvaitaVedanta, VishistadvaitaVedanta, Dwaita Vedanta, Shakti – VishishtadvaitaVedanta, Sankya and Yoga, Dharmashastra, Veda, Sahitya and Inter-disciplinary subjects.

The Karnataka SamskritUniversity, Bengaluru will award the degree of Vidyavaridhi to the students admitted as per rules, after completion of their research work duly evaluated by the examiners appointed by the University.

The Samskrit version of the degree will bear the name Vidyavaridhi and the corresponding version of the degree will be DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY.

Procedure of selection for VIDYAVARIDHI (Doctor of Philosophy)

As per the UGC regulation 2018 and KSU Rules an Entrance test will be conducted for 100 marks. The minimum qualifying marks of the test would be 50%. The syllabus of the entrance test shall consist of 50% research methodology and 50% shall be subject concerned. The Entrance test would be conducted at the Karnataka Samskrit University Campus only. The students qualified in the entrance test have to appear before the interview committee for final selection.

Medium: Samskrit only (for Thesis writing also).

(Seat allocation will be as per the state govt. reservation policy and orders issued by the state govt. from time to time)

Vidyavachaspati (D.Litt)

Any Master's Degree holders of Karnataka Samskrit University or of any other University Equivalent there to, provided the candidate has obtained his / her Master's degree in M.A in Samskrit with specialization in any one of the disciplines at least 10 years prior to submission of application.

- a. Candidates who apply for consideration for the award of the degree shall submit copies of the published work(s) / collection of research papers / book (s)/thesis.12 copies of the synopsis of each book / thesis/ work/work(s) and/or 12 copies of abstract of the research papers at the time of submitting the application.
- b. Such an application shall be accompanied by declaration duly signed by the candidate to the effect that such thesis / book / book(s) / work(s) are original and that it has not / they have not previously formed the basis for award of any degree/diploma or any other similar title of any University.
- c. The candidate must also send the DD for the Fee amount prescribed by the University for the Degree along with the application. However, scholar invited by the university is exempted from the fees.
- d. Fees are published in the University website.

Any person who has contributed to the development of any field of Samskrit Shastras or Interdisciplinary field related to Samskrit with not less than 20 years is awarded Honoris causa (D.LITT) by the University.

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❖ Department of Alankara:

Alanakara shastra deals with various theories like Alankara, Rasa, Reeti, Dhvani, Guna, Vakrokti, Auchitya etc.Detail study of these theories are of utmost importance to understand the Indian literary criticism and Indian poetics. Poetry was mostly governed by the Alankaras, the rules of critical science. Critics believed that any association of word and memory having a special quality generates kavya. The creation of mnemonic rhymes was considered essential to poetry. Poetry was considered as having two qualities: Alankara and Guna or "meaning" and "essence." There is an unbroken line of literary theory and criticism in Indian culture that goes back at least as far as the Western tradition. Indian criticism constitutes an important and largely untapped resource for literary theorists, as the Indian tradition in important respects assigns a more central role to literature than the Greek tradition does. Literary criticism in India resulted from the historical developments in poetry and drama.
